Econometrics and Health Economics

This series of workshops provides a forum for the development and dissemination of applications of econometrics in health economics.

The workshop will follow the format of the long-running European Workshops on Econometrics and Health Economics, with a particular vision to: Promote health economics research with applied microeconomics focus in Asia; strengthen research networks within the region; develop research networks with other regions; and build on the research capacity of early-career health economists in Asia.

The Workshop

The workshop program consists of up to 13 oral and 9 poster presentations. For oral presentations, each paper is allocated one hour, made up of a presentation by the author, followed by a response from a discussant and general discussion. In the poster session, the author presents four 15-minute talks in front of a small group of audiences. The number of participants will be limited to 45. **Workshop participants will be expected to attend the whole of the meeting** and play a role as either author, discussant or chairperson.

The workshop will begin in the morning of Sunday, December 4, with a key-note lectures by:

Registration fees:

For participants who are accepted for the Workshop, a registration fee of 60,000 Japanese Yen is payable in October. A reduced fee of 30,000 Japanese Yen is available for accepted participants who are registered as PhD students on August 22, 2022. We allow up to three presenters to participate online if the presenter cannot travel to Japan due to COVID-19 restrictions (fees still payable).

Registration fee includes:

Two or three nights of accommodation with breakfast and dinner; and lunch on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

Travel grants:

A limited number of travel grants will be offered to selected participants. Selection will be made based on the assessment of the paper, with priorities given to junior researchers and applicants from developing or under-represented countries.
